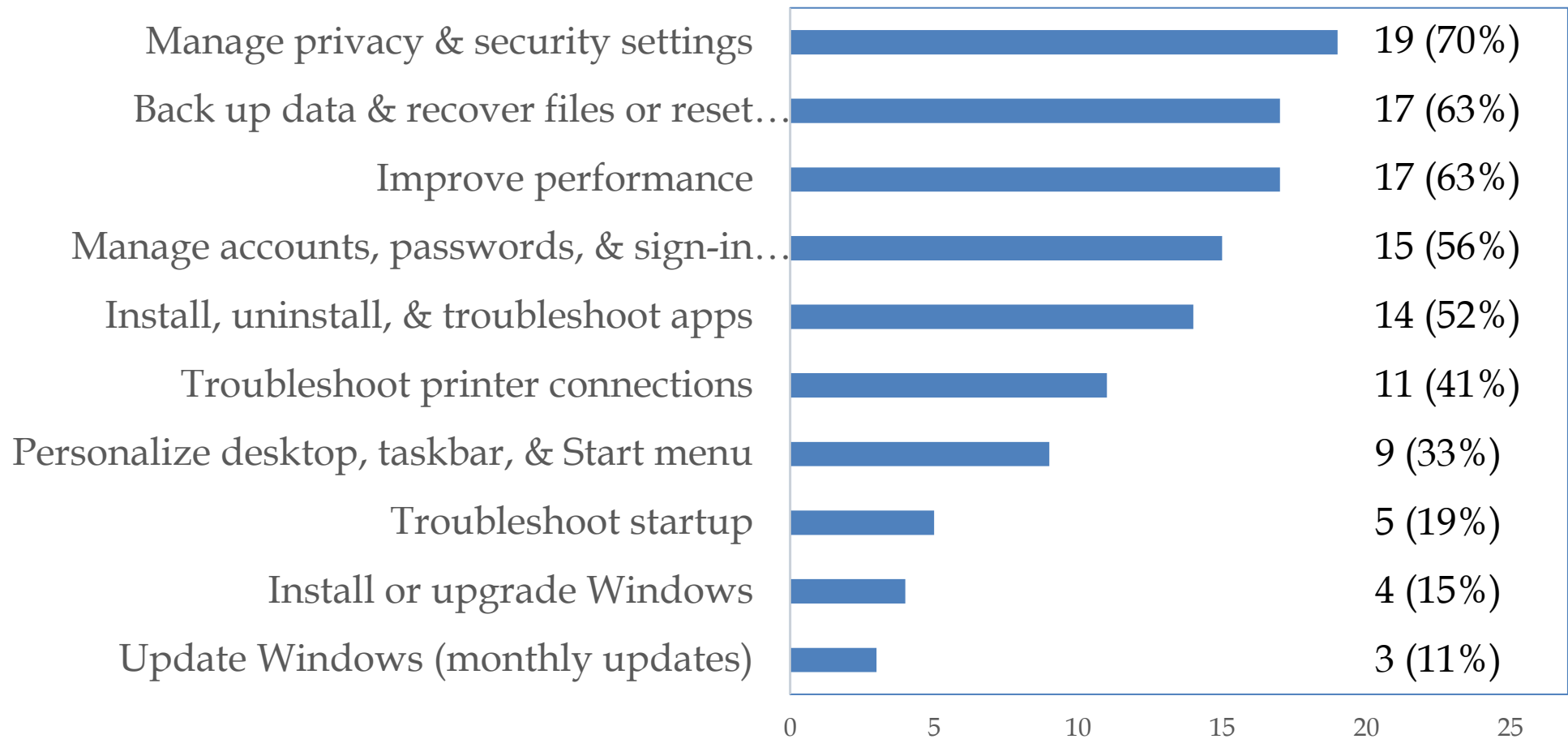

 - at least 6 years old
 - worked quite well
 - died with help from some children
- Anyone have specific recommendations for a replacement unit
- Use 2.4 GHz band



Future proofing

Even though you may only use 2.4 GHz band now

- tomorrow you may want to use the 5 GHz band
- shorter distance but faster speeds

Check: most Wi-Fi 5 devices also support 2.4 GHz

Might be too expensive to go for Wi-Fi 6E or 7

- over \$200

Aim for range extender that supports Wi-Fi 5 or Wi-Fi 6

- most under \$100

Hi Alan,

Thank you for your recent article in the June 2025 issue of the Ottawa PC Users' Group newsletter, outlining your experience using the OneDrive Client for Linux — it is greatly appreciated.

Your detailed walkthrough, including setup and use on Linux Mint, was spot on and very much appreciated.

Just a few notes and updates in response:

- *Enter the response uri [sic] from your browser*

When the URL changes, it technically becomes a URI (Uniform Resource Identifier), as it uses the http scheme to identify a resource. In this case, “URI” is correct terminology. I'm unsure whether the use of “[sic]” was to denote a perceived spelling error, but “URI” is appropriate here and might just warrant capitalisation if anything.

I know this step confuses many users. While I've attempted to clarify it in the documentation, I agree a visual example would help — I'll work on improving that section.

Additionally, the new v2.5.6 release of the client introduces support for both Microsoft Intune and the Microsoft OAuth2 Device Authorisation Flow, allowing users to authenticate without the interactive URI copying method entirely. These new authentication methods significantly simplify the process for end users.

I had considered making the Device Authorisation Flow the new default, but during testing, it became clear that Microsoft explicitly blocks this method for OneDrive Personal accounts — a disappointing but important limitation.

URL vs. URI

URI (Uniform Resource Identifier)

- Uniquely identifies a resource, which can be a location (URL), a name (URN), or both

URL (Uniform Resource Locator)

- Identifies and provides the means to locate a resource on the Internet,
e.g. a website (<https://opcug.ca>)

URN (Uniform Resource Name)

- Provide a persistent, location-independent identifier for a resource
e.g. a book (<urn:isbn:9780596154486>)

** URL and URN are subsets of URI*

- I know this step confuses many users.
- While I've attempted to clarify it in the documentation, I agree a visual example would help — I'll work on improving that section.

OneDrive cloud & OneDrive sync

- **OneDrive in the cloud** can be useful storage
 - important files stored where they:
 - are safe from local disaster (fire, theft, etc.)
 - can be shared with others
- **OneDrive sync** allows 2-way synchronization of files between OneDrive cloud and local computer(s)
- Microsoft in their *< sarcasm on > infinite wisdom < sarcasm off >*
 - decided to turn on OneDrive sync
 - decided to change default save location for Office docs to a synchronized folder
 - decided to turn on OneDrive backup
 - *all without*
 - *telling you*
 - *informing you of ramifications*

Don't Rely on System Restore

- It doesn't restore your system
- Essentially, it's a registry backup
- It's unreliable
- I turn it off
- It's just not worth it
- Use disk imaging software instead





What is *System Restore*?

- Feature introduced in Windows Millenium Edition (ME)
 - 25 years ago...
- What does it do?
 - allows you to revert your computer's
 - system files, installed applications, registry, & system settings
 - to a previous state, known as a *restore point*
- Restore points created when *significant system events occur*
 - e.g. installing new software, drivers, or Windows updates
- Can manually create restore points at any time

Follow Up What gets *Restored*?



- System Files and Settings
 - reverts Windows **system files**, installed **applications**, **drivers**, and **registry settings** to the state they were in at the selected restore point
 - including changes made by Windows updates, driver installations, and software installations or removals
- Programs and Drivers
 - programs & drivers installed after restore point are **uninstalled**
 - programs & drivers removed after restore point will be **restored**
 - *Scan for affected programs* lists affected programs and drivers
- Windows Configuration
 - settings part of the system configuration, such as system services and registry entries, are reverted to their previous state

Follow Up What *doesn't* get restored?



- Personal Files
 - documents, photos, music, videos, and other personal files
 - doesn't touch files stored in user folders like Documents, Pictures, Videos, Desktop, etc.
- Folder Structure
 - structure and contents of your personal folders remain unchanged
- **System Restore isn't a backup for personal files**
- **Can't be used for disaster recovery**
 - e.g. hard disk crash
- It is a tool for reverting system-level changes

Follow Up What if Windows won't start?

- If Windows fails to start multiple times, it enters
 - Windows Recovery Environment (WinRE)
- Force WinRE using the power button
 - turn on computer
 - at Windows logo, press & hold power button to force a shutdown
 - repeat process two more times
 - on the next startup, Windows should display *Automatic Repair*
- Using a recovery drive or installation media
 - insert USB drive and boot from it
 - click *Repair your computer*

Choose *Troubleshoot* > *Advanced options* > *System Restore*

- follow the prompts

Follow Up Does *System Restore* work?



- The proper answer to almost all questions when it comes to computers...*That depends*
- I have heard from multiple people, including a techie who worked for Microsoft
 - *System Restore didn't work for me*
- I have also heard from multiple people
 - *System restore worked great!*
- Your mileage may vary
- Always have another means of recovery such as a full system image backup
- System Restore might work and little harm in trying
